Why we need to talk to our children

Oral language is the most powerful tool that we use to communicate.

One of the best things you can do for your child is talk with them everywhere, every day, any time.

Remember talk is a thinking tool - it helps your child solve problems and develop their imagination.

Your child will get less frustrated if they are able to express their emotions or questions or opinions through language.

Use your home language to talk with your child if you feel that your ability to speak in English is not as good as your home language.

As your child learns to talk to you about their learning their ability to think will be further developed.

Children who are articulate are usually able to form friendships more easily.
